<u>DEMAND</u>: Good but irregular and grade specific. While PF1 brighter and medium categories as well as some BP1, PDUST and the DUST1 mediums and plainer, sorts were absorbed at firm to dearer levels on previous, others sold at irregularly easier tendency closely following quality. The Pakistan Packers gave useful support; with the Bazaar component of that market strong. Buyers for Afghanistan were more active to last but Kazakhstan and the other CIS Nations continued selective; with some enquiries in respect of Iran. Russia remained quiet. The Yemen and other Middle Eastern countries maintained activity, while the UK showed more interest on some of the better sorts. The Egyptian Packers continued to be a driving force on their suitable sorts. Sudan maintained activity while Somalia continued active on their preferred types.

PRICES

<u>BP1</u> – The best available sorts met an irregular demand and were absorbed at between firm to USC9 dearer to easier by upto USC28. Brighter sorts were similarly irregular and moved at firm to USC12 dearer to easier by upto USC4-16 below last levels. Mediums were fully firm to dearer by upto USC14 and more but other depreciated by a similar margin. Lower mediums met irregular interest and ranged between firm to USC35 dearer to easier by upto USC6. Plainer descriptions appreciated by upto USC5 with some selected lines gaining by upto USC34.

<u>PF1</u> – Best available were well absorbed at firm to USC12 dearer. Brighter sorts met improved demand at steady rates to USC12 higher. Mediums were dearer by USC9-14 to easier by upto USC9. Lower mediums were absorbed at irregular rates ranging between firm to USC10 above last rates; but a few lines were discounted by upto USC6. Plainer sorts were irregular and ranged between firm to USC5 dearer to easier by upto USC16.

<u>PDUST</u> – The Best categories were absorbed at irregular rates and ranged between firm to USC24 dearer to easier by upto USC19. The brighter types eased by USC1-14. Mediums were irregular and ranged between firm to USC4-16 dearer to easier by USC4-16. Lower mediums were absorbed at firm to USC3 dearer but some selected lines shed off by upto USC8. Plainer descriptions met a strong demand and gained by upto USC7 to easier by USC7.

<u>DUST1</u> – The Best available sorts were discounted by upto USC18. Brighter types shed upto USC4-15. Mediums were fully firm to easier by upto USC4-8. Lower mediums met improved demand at firm to USC25 dearer while plainer sorts were a strong feature at irregular rates ranging between firm to USC11 dearer to easier by upto USC7.

SECONDARIES

The BPs were absorbed at firm to dearer rates but the PFs eased. Clean, well sorted coloury Fannings held value but the Dusts shed value. Other Fannings were firm with similar Dusts steady. BMFs were readily absorbed.

WEATHER & CROP REPORT FOR WEEK ENDING OF 25/03/2022

Another week of stressful weather conditions in the Tea growing regions where most districts are dry and relatively hot during the day; however some locations within the larger Kisii region, Kakamega and Nandi received some light to moderate showers along with some hail damage during mid-week. Nights are generally warm across the board.

Crop intakes continue declining over most areas with East of Rift recording a sharp drop hence some factories have started plucking on alternate days with more factories considering following suit.

EAST OF RIFT

Mostly hot, dry and dusty along with warm temperatures at night but as the week progressed, some few locations within the main highlands experienced some sparse clouds but which would disappear.

Crop intakes rather low and ranged between 30,000 – 50,000 Kgs of green leaf daily.

WEST OF RIFT

Week opened sunny and hotter during the day but by mid-week, some areas within Kisii and the Nandi belt experienced some clouds along with some showers; and with some hail damage.

Crop intakes ranged between 28,000 - 50,000 Kgs over most areas and 40,000 - 60,000 Kgs over some parts within Kericho and Bomet.
